 - ALL OTHER SPECIES OF FISH MUST BE RELEASED

- Day After Labor Day – Day Before Trout Season
 - Catch and Release ONLY

Ed Thomas Memorial Fish Park Rules

1. Weekly Fish Limit - 12:00 A.M. SAT. TO THE FOLLOWING FRI. 11:59 P.M.
2. ONE DAY GUEST FISHING PASS - \$10 (Catch and Release only)
 - You must display receipt. The receipt book and drop box is located in main parking lot of the fish park
3. PA State Fishing License and Trout Stamp are required
4. All fishermen must be a MOA Member wearing a MOA Member Button and have a MOA Sticker on or visible in your vehicle while parked on MOA property
5. MOA Member Button must be displayed at all times or will be asked to leave the property. NO EXCEPTIONS!
6. NO Glass bottles and NO foam coolers
7. NO electrofishing, netting, spearing, snagging or bowfishing
8. NO Littering! All trash is to be placed in trash receptacles or taken with you.
9. NO cleaning or gutting of fish in waterway. If you clean fish at a camp site, you must take entrails with you.
10. Pets must be on a leash at all times
11. NO open fires, except in designated and marked areas
12. NO taking fish off of the stringer to replace for another fish
13. NO treble hooks permitted unless on a spoon, spinner or plug
14. NO minnow seines on property permitted
15. Only small minnow traps with a 2 inch or round hole is permitted
16. NO chumming or use of corn
17. NO use of chemicals for fishing that are not approved or permitted to be used in a waterway. (example: WD-40)
18. NO loud music.
19. The only fish that may be kept on the property are Trout and Catfish
 - Trophy Trout Members Only!
20. NO ATV's or UTV's permitted on the property without written permission
21. Any photos taken on the M.O.A property or at any M.O.A events, are the sole ownership of the M.O.A. and may be used on social media, website, advertisement and at the discretion of the M.O.A.
22. NO mishandling of fish or wildlife. If the Fish Committee feels you are not properly releasing fish and you have fish floating around you, you will be asked to leave. If it continues to happen, you will lose your membership
23. If you are releasing a fish and it has swallowed the hook, you MUST cut the line

24. You must have your own stringer. Once your limit of fish is on your stringer, you are done for the day. If this completes your full limit of the week, you are done until 12:01 a.m. of the following Saturday.
25. Fish must stay in the location of where they are caught.
26. NO stringers permitted in Catch and Release Area with or without fish on the stringer.
27. Fish that are being kept must stay in the water until you leave, on a stringer or fish bag. No keeping fish in coolers. Once fish are in your vehicle, you are done fishing for the day.
28. If you illegally take fish without an adequate membership, out of season, out of designated areas, against the rules or break laws, you will pay a minimum fee of \$50 per fish taken.

YEAR-ROUND CAMPING RULES

1. Campsites are \$10 per night. Pay camping fee at the pay station located at campground
2. Campsites must display permit receipt
3. Campsite rentals must be done by a MOA MEMBER
4. NO Littering! All trash is to be placed in trash receptacles or taken with you
5. NO glass bottles or foam containers
6. NO open fires, except in designated areas
7. Only two vehicles permitted per camp site
8. Maximum of 6 people permitted per campsite
9. Pets must be on a leash at all times
 - You are responsible to pick up and dispose of your pets' waste
10. Quiet hours are from 10pm to 7am
11. Campfires must be attended at all times
 - No burning of leaves
12. Camping checkout time is 2pm

Pistol/Shotgun Range RULES

1. Only MOA Trophy Trout MEMBERS are permitted to use the range (NO GUESTS)
2. MEMBERSHIP PIN MUST BE DISPLAYED WHILE AT THE RANGE
3. Any shooter under 18 must be accompanied by an adult member 18 or older
4. Club not responsible for accidents
5. Shoot at your own risk
6. Eye and hearing protection is recommended
7. Paper targets only
8. KEEP RANGE CLEAN; PLACE TRASH & TARGETS IN TRASH CAN
9. 1 Hour limit
10. SHOOTING TIME-D.L.S. TIME- 8:AM TO 8:PM-STD. TIME- 8:AM TO 5:PM
11. Shooting in designated areas only
12. When persons are down range, gun actions must be open
13. All guns slow fire only
14. No fully automatic guns
15. No alcoholic beverages allowed
16. Service dogs only permitted at gun range, no pets allowed
17. Destruction of property means expulsion from club

Archery Range RULES

1. Only MOA Trophy Trout Members are permitted to use the archery range (No Guests)
2. The MOA, at its discretion, may take any and all necessary action to assure the safe operation and use of its facilities.
3. MOA Trophy Trout Buttons must be visible and worn on one's person at all times while on the range.
4. Permitted Equipment: Longbow, Recurve or Compound bow. Full size Crossbow with minimum draw weight of 75 pounds. (Pistol style crossbow is not permitted). The MOA reserves the right and has final decision on what may be permitted on the range.
5. Only Target /Field Points are allowed. No fixed/mechanical or hunting style broadheads allowed!
6. Personal equipment must be inspected by the individual and maintained for safe operation.
7. No firearms or hunting allowed.
8. No more than six (6) arrows/bolts (one end) will be shot at each relay.
9. Relay time will not exceed 10 minutes
10. All shooting will be from the marked firing line only.
11. Only straight in-lane shooting is permitted. No crossing shots, roving or clout.
12. When a "Cease Fire" is called, all arrows/bolts are to be removed from the bows and all bows are to be placed safely on a bow rack. Crossbows must have arrow/bolt removed and the safety engaged.
13. Once all bows are secured on a bow rack (crossbows not cocked and unloaded) and the firing line is declared "Clear", archers may enter the range to retrieve their arrows/bolts downrange.
14. When the firing line is declared "Hot", archers may retrieve their bows from the bow rack, approach the firing line, nock arrows/bolts and resume.
15. The MOA reserves the right to revoke usage rights to any individual who does not comply with the Archery Range Rules.
16. Service dogs only permitted at archery range, no pets allowed
17. Destruction of property means expulsion from club

VIOLATIONS

1. All violations will be subject to disciplinary actions at the fish committee's discretion.
NO questions asked.
2. Any criminal actions will be subject to State and Federal laws.

Things you can do:

1. Get their pin #
2. Get their vehicle description and license plate number
3. If you feel someone is keeping too many fish, keep track of the day and the amount of fish, along with their pin # and contact the Fish Committee or drop a note in the drop box with the information.
4. If you see someone without a pin or a receipt, ask them to leave. If they do not leave, please contact the Fish Committee.
